Highlights Report

1. Plan Order Consultation

The third round of consultation was initiated on 15 August 2022. Approximately 136 beekeepers attended 10 meetings:

- 17/08/22: Southern Hub, Invercargill
- 18/08/22: Waikato Domestic Beekeepers Association, Hamilton
- 23/08/22: Canterbury Hub, Christchurch
- 25/08/22: Tairawhiti Hub, Gisborne and Ruatoria
- 02/09/22: Bay of Plenty Hub, Tauranga
- 07/09/22: Kaitaia
- 13/09/22: Nelson Hub, Nelson
- 16/09/22: Southern Discussion Group, Dunedin
- 21/09/22: Otaki Buzz Club, Otaki.

A further 59 beekeepers attended one of the 3 webinars offered.

Meetings were also organised via video conference with the five diagnostic laboratories affected by the proposed new rule requiring diagnostic laboratories to supply AFB test results to the Management Agency.

290 submissions were received by the close of consultation on 23 September 2022.

These submissions have been analysed in preparation for consideration by the Management Agency Board on 15 November 2022.

Subsequent to consideration of submissions by the Management Agency Board the proposal to amend the Biosecurity (National American Foulbrood Pest Management Plan) Order 1998 will be finalised for submission to the Minister for Biosecurity.

2. 2023/24 Budget Consultation

Collateral for the 2023/24 Budget consultation was prepared and 2023/24 budget consultation was initiated after the close of plan order consultation on 26 September 2022.

19 submissions were received by the close of consultation on 9 October 2022.

These submissions have been analysed in preparation for consideration by the Management Agency Board on 15 November 2022.

Subsequent to consideration of submissions by the Management Agency Board the Management Agency will announce the 2023/24 rate of levy in December 2022.

3. Development of Online AFB Training

Development of new online AFB Recognition and Refresher training is nearing completion and are expected to be deployed by December 2022. As part of this project the Management Agency has also reviewed and improved the classroom-based training course and videos. Classroom-based training courses transitioned to the new course materials effective 17 September 2022.

AFB Recognition Course Trainers have provided positive feedback about the new training courses.

4. Certificates of Inspection

Non-DECA holders were informed of the requirement to complete a Certificate of Inspection on 25 August 2022. 470 Certificates of Inspection had been completed by the end of October, down slightly from the 507 completed in the same period the year before.

The Management Agency has sent out email and SMS reminders. Weekly email reminders and fortnightly SMS reminders are planned for November.
